## TIDE TIMES + MOON PHASES

- Note the New Moon Phase which means there will be little moon light to guide you, it will be **VERY DARK**.
- In addition, the tidal phase will be close to spring tides (the highest of the high tides and lowest of the low tides).
- At high tide tidal routes can be cut off quicker than you might think close to high tide times.
- Be prepared, be aware of your time and distances.
- Use the alternative tidal route if unsure.
